NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a special meeting of the members of the Pleasant Valley Water Quality Coalition has been scheduled for **November 6, 2007 at 11:30 a.m.** at 27754 West Conn Avenue, Coalinga, California. The agenda for the special meeting is attached.

As you can see from the Agenda, the Coalition is required to prepare various reports for submission to the Regional Water Quality Control Board. The contents of those reports will be discussed at the meeting.

You should be aware that the costs of those reports must be paid by members of the Coalition. As will be discussed at the meeting, **the cost of those reports and the subsequent water quality tests that are certain to be required are substantial even when spread over the acreage represented by the membership of the Coalition.**

If the members of the Coalition elect to proceed with the Coalition, then each member of the Coalition will be required to pay an upfront per acre fee, as well as commit to annual per acre fees in an amount necessary to comply with the Regional Water Quality Control Board's requirements. It is critical that all of the members of the Coalition attend the November 6 special meeting so that they understand the financial obligations associated with being a member of a Coalition.

Robert Viets will discuss the per acre fee required of Coalition members in order to complete the required reports.
3. Westlands Water Quality Coalition. Robert Viets will report to the members of the Coalition the results of his investigation of the willingness of Westlands Water District to include the members of the Pleasant Valley Water Quality Coalition in Westlands own water quality coalition.
4. Designation of Committee to Govern Coalition. The Coalition Coordinator may name one or more persons to serve on a committee in connection with the governing of the Coalition and the preparation and submission of the reports or information required by the RWQCB.
